# COLOR DAY CLOTHING REMINDERS

A friendly reminder that on K-6 Color Days all students must wear school appropriate clothing when not in uniform. School appropriate clothing, according to our K-6 Parent/Student Handbook (p.11), means that shirts or dresses must have sleeves covering the shoulder, no tank tops or spaghetti style straps are allowed without a cover up over it. Shorts, dresses, skorts, and skirts must be 2 inches above the knee. Anything greater than 2 inches above the knee is not a modest and appropriate length for school. Also, during the warm weather months students are not allowed to wear open toe or open heel shoes such as sandals, flip flops, crocs, keens, etc. Students must also wear socks with their shoes. Students who are not following school dress code rules will be brought to the uniform closet to change.

Next week, June 4-7, will be dress down Color Days and on Friday, June 8, the last day of school, will be a dress up Color Day for our last school Mass of the year. Thank you for your cooperation by helping to ensure your child is dressed in school appropriate clothing next week.
